

# CANDIDATE PACKETS AVAILABLE FOR LIBRARY TRUSTEE POSITIONS

Prospective candidates for Rochester Public Library District Trustee in the April 2023 Consolidated Election may pick up a candidate packet at the library.

Qualifications for a prospective candidate include being registered to vote with at least a one-year residency in the library district at the time the nomination papers are filed. The prospective candidate must also secure the signatures of at least 19 qualified voters who reside within the Library District on a Petition for Nomination. The first day for circulating petitions is September 20, 2022.

Completed petition packets are to be filed at the library no earlier than 10:00 a.m. on December 12, 2022, and no later than 4:00 p.m. on December 19, 2022. Four of the board's seven seats will be up for election in April; three are for four-year full terms and the fourth seat is for a two-year term. All terms will commence on Thursday, June 8, 2023.

The three incumbents who are running again for the four-year terms are **Jessica** Ingold, Elaine Honomichl-Lewis and Sarah Deen.

The Rochester Public Library District Board of Trustees has the legal authority and responsibility to see that the library is well managed, and that it operates in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois and the policies established by the Board itself. The Board of Trustees regularly meets on the second Thursday of each month at 6:00 p.m. at the Library.


#### Arm Knitting Chunky Blanket Class Tuesday, January 24 | 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. Registration Required | 15 max.
